



What's in the Kit?

Use with ... Water based paint, oil based paint, estapol timber stain, timber oil, varnish, paving paint, suede effects & more ...

The kit comes with full instructions for use, a sheet of hints & tips to get you started ... and you'll find loads more info in FAQ



A. Large Brush

Use on large areas ... walls, ceilings, floors, decks, fences weatherboards, pergolas, brickwork, VJ panelling, plaster fibro and gyprock. Quick and easy with water based (acrylic) paint, timber stains & oils light varnish and floor sealers.

B. Medium Brush

Use on trim work, furniture, handrails, gutters, cornice corrugated sheeting, beading and panelling for a spray gun finish with oil based paint, enamel, varnish and estapol.

C. Extension Clip

Locks into the large handle for easy access to out of reach areas, high walls, ceilings and floors. Fits standard 1 inch broomstick. * Broomstick not included.

D. Mini Brush

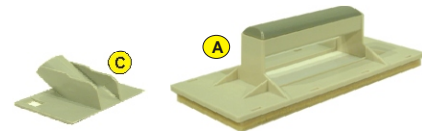
A clean edge & a light touch assures no mess precision painting when cutting in & edging ... windows, architraves skirting boards etc ... wrought iron, louvre doors, right angle corners, fiddly bits & tight, awkward places.

E. Large Mixer-Loader tray

Use with large brush ... as you load the brush the rotating wheel applies the right amount of paint to the tips of the bristles giving a **DRIP FREE** and even application whilst mixing the paint at the same time. **No mess ... No waste !!**

F. Medium Mixer-Loader Tray

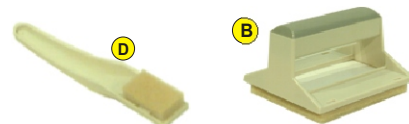
Use with medium brush for oil based paints and smaller jobs with water based (acrylic) paints.



Cornice is Easy



Remove the pad from the medium handle and turn it sideways before you put it back in ... you'll see that it's too long this way. Bend it gently in the middle and click the pad into position. In one more notch for small cornice & corrugated sheeting, In one more again for tight beading, panelling & deeper recesses.



Right angle corners a breeze



Put your thumb under the laminated back of the pad and slide the pad out. Gently bend the pad over your finger and place it back in the handle sideways. Keep the pad resting against the front guard of the handle for added stability.



How do I wash the pads ?

Remove the pad from the handle.
Water based paints soak the pad in a bucket of warm water for about 20 minutes. Rinse out dirty water under a warm tap and leave to dry naturally.
Oil based paints soak in approx 10 mm of mineral turpentine for 10 minutes, then remove dirty turps and repeat. Then make sure you wash the dirty turps out thoroughly and leave to dry naturally. Methylated spirits may also be used in the same method if required.

How long will the pads last ?

A set of pads should paint at least a 3 bedroom house ... Inside and outside with 2 coats of paint. You will get a longer life from them with practice as you learn to ease the pressure off. Rougher surfaces will of course wear them out a little faster. You can deal directly with us by phone, fax or internet anytime you need replacement pads.
